1. The standard of success was that 70% of the students who received the AALAT degree would transfer to a four-year institution. During our assessment period, 100% of students successfully transferred so the standard was achieved.
2. The standard of success was that 70% of those students that transferred would graduate from the institution they transferred to. Here we restricted the data to those who transferred in the period from fall 2016-through 2018 to allow time for them to complete at least two years at the transfer institution (our data ends at winter 2019). Out of this group, 59 students transferred with 20 of those students graduating. This was 33.89% which was below our success standard.

Strengths:

The degree does very well in terms of preparing students to transfer. 100% of those receiving the degree successfully transferred to a four-year institution.

Weaknesses:

We did not meet the standard of success for graduation at the institution of transfer. The standard that we initially proposed, though, may have been too high. The graduation rate for

WCC is 22.3%. At EMU, where 50.8% of this group transferred to, the rate is 39.7%. Thus, our rate of 33.89% falls roughly between these two institutions and may be a reasonable measure. As a department, we will discuss more what our benchmark for the second outcome should be. We will work with C&A as well as institutional research to determine what would be a reasonable expectation for this outcome. We will also look at the data from the next round of assessment in making this decision.
