- 4. Acquire manual skills using liquid and color media.

- 5. Acquire awareness and control of marks as equivalent for texture both in reference to visible world and surface movement on a two dimensional page.
- 6. Demonstrate concept of figure/ground interrelatedness in compositions.
- 7. Apply concepts of composition: organization of areas of page, dynamic movement, surface movement, and rhythm.
- 8. Apply contemporary approaches to new compositional arrangements through mark-making and value to create space.
- 9. Acquire and use vocabulary of the discipline to describe and evaluate drawings by self, classmates, and master artists.
