- 11. Practice basic psychomotor skills for nursing care.
- 12. Discuss delegation from the perspective of the Registered Nurse.
- 13. Use American Psychological Association (APA) style to format a page of journal references.
- 14. Participate in simulated patient encounters while exercising critical thinking, spiritual/cultural sensitivity and RN scope of practice.
- 15. Exhibit empathetic, compassionate and caring interactions and behaviors while participating in simulated patient encounters.
